

22578VIC COURSE IN FIRST AID MANAGEMENT OF ANAPHYLAXIS

Description

This course provides the skills and knowledge required to identify and assist a person suffering an anaphylactic reaction until emergency arrives. Additionally, the course will provide you with the knowledge to develop strategies to prevent exposure to known allergens and minimise the risks related to anaphylaxis.

The course is suitable for anyone new to first aid training and for those wanting to update or refresh their skills.

Course cost / duration

Cost: \$70.00 per person
Course duration: 4 hours

Group bookings:

Melbourne metropolitan area - minimum course cost is based on a group of 6 people
Victorian country locations - minimum course cost is based on a group of 12 people



Course content

- Recognise signs and symptoms of an allergic reaction, including anaphylaxis
- Provide appropriate first aid treatment for an anaphylactic reaction in accordance the ASCIA Action Plan for Anaphylaxis
- Communicate details of the incident
- Identify individuals at risk of allergic reactions and anaphylaxis
- Develop individual anaphylaxis management plans
- Implement strategies to prevent allergic and anaphylactic reactions
- Develop and implement strategies to reduce risk



Assessment

A Statement of Attainment will be issued on successful completion of a range of assessments. This includes multiple choice questionnaires, documentation of an individual anaphylaxis management plan, verbal interviews and the observation of practical skills such as following the instructions on an ASCIA Action Plan to administer a dose of adrenaline (using an auto-injector trainer).
