

HLTAID012 PROVIDE FIRST AID IN AN EDUCATION AND CARE SETTING

Description

This course provides the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to infants, children and adults. The course applies to educators and support staff working within an education and care setting who are required to respond to a first aid emergency, including asthma and anaphylaxis emergencies. This course is approved by the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) and satisfies the requirements for first aid, anaphylaxis management and emergency asthma training in the early education environment as required by Education and Care Services National Law and the Education and Care Services National Regulations.



Course cost / duration

Course content

- Perform the steps of the DRSABCD basic life support action plan
- Use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) – including considerations when using an AED on children
- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)
- Management of the unresponsive casualty
- Legal responsibilities / duty of care
- Standard precautions for infection control
- Medical emergencies such as: cardiac emergencies, anaphylaxis, asthma, choking, burns, envenomation, head & spinal injuries, bleeding control, fractures, dislocations, soft tissue injuries and hazardous substances
- General signs and symptoms of acute illness in children and infants

Assessment

A Statement of Attainment will be issued on successful completion of a range of assessments. This includes multiple choice questionnaires, verbal interviews and the observation of practical skills such as following the prompts of an AED, completing CPR on a manikin on the floor, using first aid equipment and resources when providing first aid for asthma, anaphylaxis and envenomation.

Statement of Attainment

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All participants must provide a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI) prior to the release of a Statement of Attainment. If you do not have a USI you can create one on www.usi.gov.au.

The Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) recommends renewing CPR skills on an annual basis. First aid skills should be renewed every three years.

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
