

HLTAID013 PROVIDE FIRST AID IN REMOTE OR ISOLATED SITE

Description

This first aid course provides the skills and knowledge to provide a first aid response to a casualty in a remote or isolated situation, over an extended period of time until medical assistance is provided, or evacuation occurs.

This course applies to all persons who may be working in a remote or isolated workplace.

Course cost / duration

Cost: \$465.00 per person
Course duration: 3 days - 8:30am – 4:00pm each day

Group bookings:

Melbourne metropolitan area - minimum course cost based on 8 people
Victorian country locations - minimum course cost based on 12 people

Course content

- Casualty assessment, observations and history taking
- Coordinating first aid activities including triage, dealing with multiple casualties, casualty packaging and movement
- Medical emergencies such as: cardiac emergencies, anaphylaxis, asthma, choking, burns, envenomation, head & spinal injuries, bleeding control, fractures, dislocations, soft tissue injuries, hypothermia and hyperthermia
- Life threatening bleeding requiring the use of tourniquets and haemostatic dressings
- Remote considerations in the provision of first aid such as: environment, communication equipment and evacuation preparation
- Assess vital signs of casualty while completing first aid scenarios, plus much more...



Assessment

A Statement of Attainment will be issued on successful completion of a range of assessments. This may include written questionnaires, verbal interviews and the observation of practical skills such as following the prompts of an AED, completing CPR on a manikin on the floor, using first aid equipment/resources when providing first aid for asthma, anaphylaxis and envenomation

All participants must provide a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI) prior to the release of a Statement of Attainment. If you do not have a USI you can create one on www.usi.gov.au.
